### FLYING ARTS WORKSHOP SUCCESS

After confirmation of funding for tutor and photographer, ACT contacted Natasha at Flying Arts who sent copies of CVs for suggested tutors. ACT selected tutors to find these were not available. Flying Arts found Bev Ridsdill-Kenny who turned out to be perfect for our purpose of community mosaic capacity building. ACT set up the space, taking great care to protect the new table tops and floor of the hired TAS space at Culliford House. A large range of materials and tools were sourced, sorted, organised and set up and Allan Bruce inducted us into the rules of the space before the workshops. On day one, Bev explained the history and techniques of

mosaic to the 17 participants some of whom were experienced and others beginners. All had been asked to come with a simple design. Techniques were demonstrated and on day one tiles cut and alued to visualise that design. ACT members' large tile cutters set up were useful and Bev kept mixing the Mapei adhesive as required for sticking cut pieces to the prepared Villaboard squares. Bev decided to limit materials to tiles and avoid glass for less experienced participants. Pixie, one of our experienced mosaic artists, had already cut glass tessera and on the second day one of her pieces was used to demonstrate grouting. On day two more

than half the participants were able to experience the grouting process, as the adhesive on their boards were completely dry. All but one took the opportunity to start a second board. Most would have liked more time but all ranked every aspect of the workshops as ei-

ther excellent or very good on the Flying arts feedback forms.

(We find out about funding for that in the first week of December.) At the AGM participates showed their works and told the stories of their pieces – a very moving experience!

# Q. How important do you think an arts specific degree is for a person wanting a career as an Art-ist?

The TAFE course I feel wasn't as important as the people I met during my studies.

Going to TAFE gave me a lot of confidence be-

cause I had never really fitted in in my life. For me, finding like minded people at TAFE was very important. The teachers



helped me focus on an area, and the questions presented to me helped me to narrow my direction in art, but it was the community that propelled me forward in my arts career. My art studies were very important because they gave me the knowledge and confidence to show my art.

I would never have guessed five years ago that I would be an installation artists rather than a painter.

### Q. Do you believe that being a fine artist is a viable career?

I do believe that it is a viable career. It's been such a busy year for me, it's been rewarding and fulfilling; although I haven't made money from art! In the future I believe I will be able to make money as my work becomes recognised and I am invited to exhibit more widely. I am not trying to sell artwork to you and me, I am trying to sell art to businesses and organisations. I would love to have something in the local Toowoomba area.

### Q. Do you have any upcoming projects you can tell us about?

I am going to Thailand to do a Artist Residency organised by *made Creative space* in 2012. I am having a another solo show at *made* also in 2012, as well as creating work for the Toowoomba Flood Marker project, as well as exhibiting at Blockwork later next year. SWELL and other site specific installation in other states are also on the list!..


